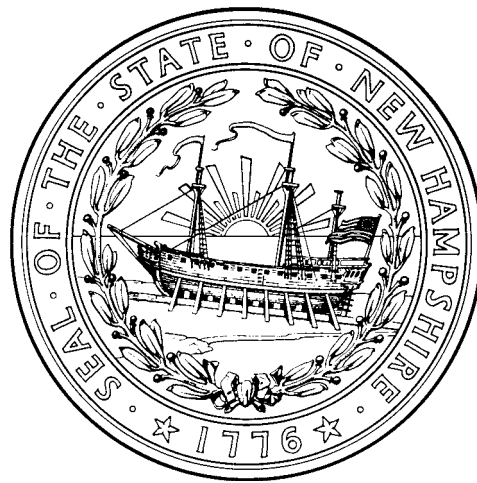

January 4, 2012

The Senate reconvened at 1 p.m., a quorum being present.

The Reverend Kate Atkinson, guest chaplain to the Senate, offered the following meditative thoughts and prayer.

Happy New Year. And, my message to you is interesting, having been sitting here and listening to all of these roll calls, you'll see what I mean. I'm talking about someone called Madeleine L'Engle; I'm sure many of you know her. She was a prolific writer of fiction and nonfiction and poetry and autobiography for children and adults. And, one of the memorable life events she wrote about was the very first time her parents allowed her to stay up until midnight on New Year's Eve and see the New Year in. And she describes how, as the village clock was striking 12, her father took out his brand new pocket calendar for the year, and he, her mother, and Madeleine herself each signed their name in that pocket calendar. And, she wrote: "It was Father's way of saying 'yes' to Mother and to me and to the new year, no matter what it might bring. It would have been much easier for him to withdraw from it..."—from the new year—"but he refused to withdraw...I knew this without understanding it in the least, and was grateful as I added my signature to Mother's and his."

And, it just makes me think about how a new year offers us so many opportunities and challenges and possibilities and new adventures and new directions, and many of them can appear very daunting. They can seem as though we might want to withdraw from them, and we might want to be a little more cautious. But, we can have the greatest affect on our lives and on the life of the world if we are able to say 'yes' to 2012. I don't think that means 'yes' on every roll call, but I think it means saying 'yes' to any number of challenges in this new year. Let us pray.

For all the possibilities ahead in this new year, make us thankful, O God. Give us wisdom, courage, and discernment in the face of so much chaos, despair, and fear. Help us to see how, in our circumstances, we can contribute to peace, faith, and love; And give us the will to translate your desires into our actions. Amen.

SENATOR KELLY: Thank you, Mister President. I would just like to take a moment here and just really state that the State of New Hampshire lost an outstanding—and, I should say outstanding—probate judge with the death of Judge Albert Weeks on December 31st of 2011.

Most of us know Judge Weeks as “Kip”, and because he is a dear friend, it even makes it a little bit more difficult. But, Judge Weeks served as the Cheshire County Probate Judge from the year 2000 until 2011. Prior to his judgeship, he practiced law in Keene, and I had the honor of working with him right after graduating from law school; I worked with him in his law firm. And, prior to him going to law school and becoming a lawyer, he was a journalist; he graduated from Princeton, and he worked at the *Keene Sentinel*. So, he touched many, many lives in our community.

Three years ago, while Kip was out with his family cutting down a Christmas tree, he fainted. And, he was diagnosed with brain cancer. He died at the age of 63, and he leaves his wife, Chris, and two young adults.

Kip was always thoughtful and compassionate in all of his work, and he always went to great lengths, as a judge, in his opinions, to make sure that all parties truly understood his intentions behind his opinions; he took a lot of time and effort. He will be greatly missed in the community and by all of those that he served. And, as I said, he is also a personal friend.

My son, Patrick, said the other day: “Mom, he is the kindest man I’ve ever met.” And, he is right. Kip touched many, many lives, and he will be missed, but never forgotten. He was a just and very fair man, and I would just like that for the record. Thank you.

SENATOR LARSEN: I realized in our absence from the Senate during the fall, we were not in session for me to be able to recognize the passing of George Wilson.

George Wilson was the publisher of the *Concord Monitor*, a good outdoorsman; had a real interest in promoting the highest level of journalism. Many of *Concord Monitor*’s journalists have gone on to the major newspapers of our country, and he apparently encouraged each journalist to go out and do their best in the ways they could. His photography within his newspaper always won awards. And, he loved the outdoors as well as the reporting of news. He set a high standard. His family had newspapers in other cities, but he was a gentleman and a friend, and someone who held the highest respect, both in the field of journalism and as a citizen in our state and our nation.

So, I wish to mark the passing of George Wilson and to extend our Senate condolences to the Wilson family. Thank you.
