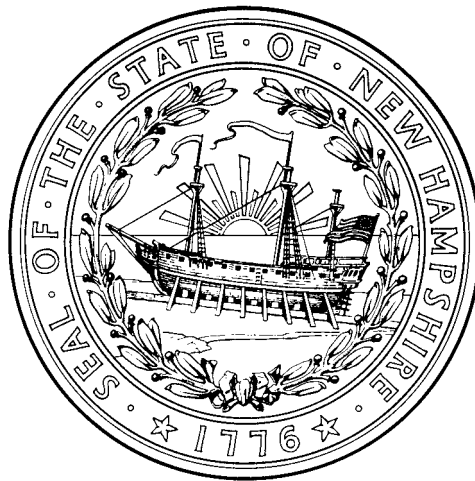

HB 1267, relative to the family hike safe card for fish and game search and recovery expenses. Ought to Pass with Amendment, Vote 5-0. Senator Fuller Clark for the committee.

This bill adds individuals under a family guardianship to the definition of family for the voluntary hike safe card issued by the fish and game department for search and recovery response expenses. The committee believes that this bill is important in order to allow individuals, such as adult children who are still under the guardianship of their parents, to receive the family pricing of the hike safe card.

**Amendment to HB 1267**

Amend the bill by replacing section 2 with the following:

2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

HB 1268, relative to liability for payment of expenses of search and rescue recovery by the fish and game department. Ought to Pass with Amendment, Vote 5-0. Senator Sanborn for the committee.

This bill clarifies the liability of persons requiring search and rescue response from the fish and game department for certain negligent, criminal, or reckless actions. The committee believes that this legislation is important in order to ensure that individuals are being as responsible as possible in their outdoor activities across the state.

### **Amendment to HB 1268**

Amend the bill by replacing section 3 with the following:

3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

### **EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENTS AND ADMINISTRATION**

HB 1357-FN, relative to the duties of the department of cultural resources. Ought to Pass, Vote 5-0. Senator Reagan for the committee.

This bill establishes the division of film and digital media in the department of cultural resources in order to stay up to date with technological developments. This bill also reclassifies a current position.

HB 1553-FN, transferring the administration of the telecommunications accounting unit. Ought to Pass, Vote 5-0. Senator Soucy for the committee.

This bill transfers the statewide telecommunications accounting unit from the Department of Safety to the Department of Information Technology. This bill will also transfer positions from the Department of Safety to the Department of Information Technology, will abolish two positions in the Department of Safety, and establish one new full-time position within the Department of Information Technology.

HB 1594-FN, relative to emergency medical services. Ought to Pass, Vote 5-0. Senator Reagan for the committee.

This legislation makes various changes to laws regarding emergency medical services, including the requirement of a fingerprint criminal history records check for provider licensure for certain personnel licensed to provide emergency medical services. This bill also establishes a penalty for false reports concerning investigations.

### **PUBLIC AND MUNICIPAL AFFAIRS**

HB 1164, relative to contributions by a city to the county or state. Ought to Pass with Amendment, Vote 5-0. Senator Stiles for the committee.

This bill permits cities to voluntarily contribute funds or resources to county or state projects. The bill was introduced to only allow cities to do this, but the committee amended it to also allow towns.

### **Amendment to HB 1164**

Amend the title of the bill by replacing it with the following:

AN ACT relative to contributions by a city or town to the county or state.

Amend the bill by inserting after section 1 the following and renumbering the original section 2 to read as 3:

2 New Section; Towns; Contributions to County or State. Amend RSA 31 by inserting after section 103 the following new section:

31:103-a Contributions to County or State. A town may, by vote of the legislative body, voluntarily contribute funds, services, property, or other resources toward any county or state project, program, or plan. Any contribution involving the expenditure of funds under this section shall be subject to the requirements of RSA 32.

### **AMENDED ANALYSIS**

This bill permits cities and towns to voluntarily contribute funds or resources to county or state projects.

HB 1181, relative to designating an alternate cemetery trustee. Ought to Pass, Vote 5-0. Senator Kelly for the committee.

This bill simply permits the board of cemetery trustees to appoint alternate cemetery trustees, in order to ensure that if a vacancy arises, an alternate can seamlessly transition into the position.

HB 1220, relative to disqualification of election officers. Ought to Pass, Vote 5-0. Senator Stiles for the committee.

This bill clarifies the implications of the disqualification of an election officer by removing a sentence that no longer applies to anything in the statute.

HB 1244-L, relative to municipal cemeteries. Ought to Pass, Vote 5-0. Senator Stiles for the committee.

This bill permits towns to enter into agreements with other entities to provide for cemeteries. This is a cost efficiency measure to aid municipalities who do not have the space to meet their cemetery duties.

## TRANSPORTATION

HB 466-FN, relative to farm tractor plates for certain specialized vehicles. Ought to Pass, Vote 5-0. Senator Birdsell for the committee.

This bill allows certain specialized vehicles used for agricultural purposes to qualify for farm tractor plates. Some equipment, such as backhoes, is required to be registered as construction equipment, costing farmers hundreds of dollars. This bill is important in order to allow those individuals to register this type of equipment as farming equipment in order to pay a more suitable registration fee. Farmers must sign a statement stating that they will not use the equipment for any purpose other than farming.

HB 535-FN, relative to signs advising motorists approaching highway emergencies. Ought to Pass, Vote 5-0. Senator Watters for the committee.

This bill establishes a fund in the department of transportation, funded by payments from public-private agreements, for the sole purpose of posting signs advising motorists to give one lane of clearance to emergency vehicles in the breakdown lane. The bill also specifies locations for those signs. The committee believes that this legislation is important in order to protect police officers and emergency vehicles from further danger by giving notice to the public of the state's "move over" law.

HB 1430-FN, relative to registration of compact utility tractors. Ought to Pass with Amendment, Vote 5-0. Senator Birdsell for the committee.

This bill establishes registration, operation, and equipment requirements for compact utility tractors. The committee amended the bill in order to correct language that was accidentally omitted by the Office of Legislative Services from the introduced version of the bill. The committee believes this bill is important in order to allow residential homeowners to register their compact utility tractors for non-commercial use on secondary roadways.

### Amendment to HB 1430-FN

Amend the bill by replacing section 1 with the following:

1 Words and Phrases; Compact Utility Trailer Added. Amend RSA 259:13-a to read as follows:

259:13-a ***Compact Utility Tractor. "Compact utility tractor" shall mean any self-propelled 4-wheel vehicle utilizing diesel fuel, with a rated horsepower not to exceed 28 horsepower, that is capable of carrying not more than one occupant, is equipped by the manufacturer with at least one PTO (power take-off) in addition to any PTO installed for the purpose of an under-tractor mower deck, and has no provision for carrying a load other than attached implements such as snowplows, tool boxes, or bucket loaders.***

**259:13-aa** Consigned. "Consigned," as used in RSA 261:104, shall mean entrusted by a notarized written statement to a dealer as consignee, whereby the dealer has agreed to hold a vehicle for the consignor for the purpose of selling it.

Amend RSA 195:32, I as inserted by section 1 of the bill by replacing all after subparagraph (i) with the following:

(j) One member of the public who has experience with the process of withdrawing from a cooperative school district, appointed by the chairperson of the house education committee.

(k) One member of the public who has experience with the process of withdrawing from a cooperative school district, appointed by the chairperson of the senate education committee.

Amend RSA 195:32, V as inserted by section 1 of the bill by replacing it with the following:

V. The members of the commission shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The first meeting of the commission shall be called by the first-named house member. The first meeting of the commission shall be held within 30 days of the effective date of this section. Seven members of the commission shall constitute a quorum.

**Amendment to HB 1616-FN**

Amend the bill by replacing section 15 with the following:

15 Provision for Federal Identification Database Prohibited. Amend RSA 260:14-a to read as follows:

260:14-a Provision for Federal Identification Database Prohibited.

***I. Except as provided in this section, the department shall not provide [a complete, or substantially complete or mirrored, extract of motor vehicle records that contain] any personally identifiable information from any file or database to the federal or any state government or to any agent or agency of, or contractor engaged by, the federal or any state government [for] with knowledge that the request has the purpose or reasonably likely effect of creating or enhancing a federal identification database.***

***II. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the department is authorized to participate in the National Driver Register (NDR) and Problem Driver Pointer System (PDPS), to achieve the state's compliance with the provisions of the National Driver Register Act of 1982, as amended, and its implementing regulations, and to facilitate the state's compliance with the provisions of the driver license compact authorized by RSA 263:77.***

***III. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the department is authorized to participate in the Commercial Driver's License Information System (CDLIS), to achieve the state's compliance with the provisions of the Federal Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act 1986, as amended, and its implementing regulations.***

***IV. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the department is authorized to participate in the National Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (NLETS).***

***V. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the department is authorized to participate in the National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS), to achieve the state's compliance with the provisions of the Federal Anti Car Theft Act of 1992, as amended, and its implementing regulations.***

***VI. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the department is authorized to participate in a pointer based state-to-state driver verification system with information from applicants for drivers' licenses and identification cards pursuant to RSA 263:14-b, RSA 263:14-c, RSA 260:21-a, and RSA 260:21-b.***

Amend the bill by inserting after section 15 the following and renumbering the original sections 16-17 to read as 17-18, respectively:

16 Records and Certification. Amend RSA 260:14, III to read as follows:

***III. Motor vehicle records may be made available pursuant to a court order or in response to a request from a state, a political subdivision of a state, the federal government, or a law enforcement agency for use in official business. The request shall be on a case-by-case basis. Any records received pursuant to this paragraph shall not be further transferred or otherwise made available to any other person or listed entity not authorized under this paragraph. Any records received pursuant to this paragraph shall not be used, further transferred, or otherwise made available to any other person or entity for the purpose of creating or enhancing a federal identification database.***

## AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill:

I. Allows a person obtaining a driver's license or nondriver's picture identification card to choose whether the license or identification card complies with the Real ID Act of 2005.

II. Authorizes optional enhanced drivers' licenses and optional enhanced nondrivers' picture identification cards which meet the standards of the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative.

III. Establishes exceptions to the prohibition on state participation in a federal identification database.

The question is on the adoption of the Committee Amendment. Adopted.

## Floor Amendment to HB 1616-FN

Amend RSA 260:14-a, I as inserted by section 15 of the bill by replacing it with the following:

***I. Except as provided in this section***, the department shall not provide, ***directly or indirectly***, a complete, or substantially complete or mirrored, extract of motor vehicle records, ***or a significant portion thereof***, that contain personally identifiable information from any file or database to the federal ***or any state*** government or to any agent or agency of, or contractor engaged by, the federal ~~government for the purpose of creating or enhancing a federal identification database~~***or any state governments***.

The question is on the adoption of the Floor Amendment. Adopted.

## Floor Amendment to HB 1616-FN

Amend the bill by replacing sections 6-7 with the following:

6 Identification Cards. Amend RSA 260:21, III to read as follows:

III. The identification card shall bear the name, address, date of birth, blood type (optional), veteran's status for the purposes of identification for receiving benefits and services under New Hampshire law (optional), picture and signature of the applicant, and in the case of a card issued pursuant to RSA 260:21, I(c), said card shall bear the notation "Golden Granite State Discount Card." ***An applicant may choose not to have his or her facial image, signature, and social security number retained by the department, in which case the identification card shall bear an approved security marking indicating that it was not issued in compliance with Public Law 109-13 and is therefore not acceptable for federal identification purposes.***

7 New Paragraph; Identification Cards. Amend RSA 260:21 by inserting after paragraph XI the following new paragraph:

XII. Unless the applicant chooses not to have his or her facial image, signature, and social security number retained by the department, the department shall issue a nondriver's picture identification card that is compliant with the standards of the Real ID Act of 2005, Public Law 109-13, and its implementing regulations, including, but not limited to, 6 C.F.R. part 37, or an enhanced identification card as proof of identity and citizenship for persons entering the United States at land and sea ports which meet the standards of the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative developed by the United States Department of State and the United States Department of Homeland Security, and its associated regulations, including but not limited to Documents Required for Travelers Departing From or Arriving in the United States at Sea and Land Ports-of-Entry From Within the Western Hemisphere, 73 Fed. Reg. 18,384, Apr. 3, 2008, respectively, in lieu of an identification card defined in RSA 260:21.

Amend RSA 260:21-a, I(c) as inserted by section 8 of the bill by replacing it with the following:

(c) Has not opted out of the requirements of this section by requesting that the department not retain his or her facial image, signature, and social security number.

Amend RSA 260:21-b, I(c) as inserted by section 8 of the bill by replacing it with the following:

(c) Has not opted out of the requirements of this section by requesting that the department not retain his or her facial image, signature, and social security number.

Amend RSA 263:14-b as inserted by section 11 of the bill by replacing it with the following:

263:14-b Driver's License Compliant with Public Law 109-13. Except for applicants who choose not to have their facial image, signature, and social security number retained by the department, the department of safety shall issue drivers' licenses which meet the standards of the Real ID Act of 2005, Public Law 109-13, and its implementing regulations, including but not limited to 6 C.F.R. part 37. The department shall upon application issue a driver's license that complies with Public Law 109-13 to any resident who:

I. Pays the required fee;

II. Does not hold any other driver's license or nondriver's picture identification card;

III. Has not opted out of the requirements of this section by requesting that the department not retain his or her facial image, signature, and social security number; and

IV. Provides documents required to demonstrate identity, United States citizenship, social security number, and New Hampshire residency.

Amend RSA 263:14-c, III as inserted by section 11 of the bill by replacing it with the following:

III. Has not opted out of the requirements of this section by requesting that the department not retain his or her facial image, signature, and social security number; and

Amend RSA 263:40, I as inserted by section 12 of the bill by replacing it with the following:

**I.** The commissioner shall, upon payment of the required fee, issue to every applicant a driver's license subject to such conditions as the commissioner may deem expedient and in such form as the commissioner may prescribe. Licenses issued to persons under the age of 21 shall be designed so that their horizontal and vertical axes are opposite the horizontal and vertical axes of licenses issued to other persons, and said licenses shall prominently display the date on which the licensee shall attain the age of 21 years. Consistent with RSA 263:14, the youth operator license shall expire on the 21st anniversary of the applicant's date of birth, at which time the applicant shall be issued a traditional license. The license shall bear thereon a distinguishing number assigned to the licensee and an instant full-face color photograph, image, or likeness of the licensee. There shall also be provided a space wherein the licensee may indicate his or her honorable veteran's status for purposes of identification for receiving benefits and services under New Hampshire law if the licensee so desires. The license shall bear a special designation or symbol indicating honorable veteran's status for licensees who indicate such veteran status. ***An applicant may choose not to have his or her facial image, signature, and social security number retained by the department, in which case the driver's license card shall bear an approved security marking indicating that it was not issued in compliance with Public Law 109-13 and is therefore not acceptable for federal identification purposes.***

#### AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill requires that drivers' licenses and nondrivers' picture identification cards comply with the Real ID Act of 2005 unless the applicant chooses a noncompliant license or card.
