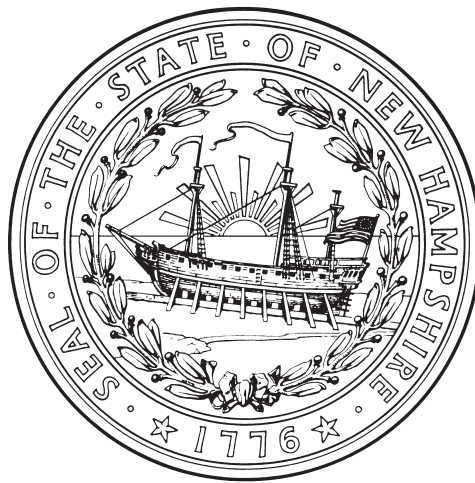

ANNOUNCEMENTS

(The Chair recognized Senator Birdsell.)

SENATOR BIRDSELL: Thank you, Madam President. I'd like to take a moment of personal privilege. I don't know if you all know, but I've been doing a lot of work the past few years with an organization called Homeland Heroes. And they help veterans and active military coming back out of the service to get themselves established by giving, donating things such as household items and furniture for those individuals. But I'm also on the commission to study PTSD. So between the two of those, Homeland Heroes and the commission, through Homeland Heroes I have been aware of a seminar that's going to be going on in Concord on October 11th called, Moral Injury: Combat's Deep Wound, which is going to cover some of the, basically what moral injury is, is it results from experiences which transgress our deep mortal beliefs and expectations which can cause the painful psychology and is connected with PTSD. There's going to be four speakers, Reverend Doctor Dayl Hufford and David Wood who's a Pulitzer Prize winning journalist, he's covered war and conflict around the world for more than thirty-five years and Doctor Jessica Goodell, served in the Marine Corps from 2001 to 2005, and she published *Shade It Black: Death and After in Iraq*, in 2011. It was a memoir capturing her experiences as a member of the Mortuary Affairs in the military. And also, Ginger Munson who's also served in active. They're going to be covering topics that I think are near and dear to anyone who's suffering from PTSD or moral injury and I would recommend if anyone's interested in attending, contact me. I'll be attending and I can get you signed up. Thank you, Madam President.

PRESIDENT SOUCY: I would just like to thank a couple other groups that made everything we did possible. I certainly thank all of you, the capable leadership of our Finance Chair, and everyone who participated in the negotiations. But we would not have been able to do what we did without the very able diligent and capable work of the Legislative Budget Assistant and his staff, as well as the staff of OLS, led by David Alukonis. So, I'd ask all of you to join with me in thanking all of them for getting us to this point.
