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Senate passes Const Amd prohibiting a personal income tax

Bi-partisan supporters say CACR 13 crucial to keeping NH advantage

CONCORD – The Senate passed a constitutional amendment today with bi-partisan support prohibiting a personal income tax from being levied on New Hampshire residents. The measure, which was approved by the House in January, is expected to be placed on the ballot this November for voter approval.

Senate Majority Leader Jeb Bradley, R-Wolfeboro, led the floor debate in support of **CACR 13** saying:

“One of the major reasons New Hampshire enjoys such an advantage over other states is our tax structure. And it’s a tax structure that’s critical to maintaining the New Hampshire we all know and love. The voters told us loud and clear last November to live within our means, to end out of control spending. CACR 13 makes a serious statement to voters that we’ve heard them because a constitutional amendment prohibiting lawmakers from raising revenues from a personal income tax will absolutely force state government to act more responsibly with taxpayer dollars. I look forward to voters passing this important change to our constitution in the fall.”

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
