## **Senate statement regarding House vote on CACR 12**

CONCORD – Senate President Peter Bragdon, R-Milford, and Majority Leader Jeb Bradley, R-Wolfeboro, issued the following statement regarding today's vote by the House creating a Committee of Conference regarding CACR 12:

"The Senate remains committed to putting the issue of education funding before the voters of New Hampshire and we believe CACR 12 represents the best chance of passing an amendment in twenty years."

"The House taking up CACR 12 today, and not getting a majority means we have work to do. However, this presents the Senate with the opportunity, during the Committee of Conference, to reinforce the broad, bi-partisan support the amendment has from legislators, the Coalition Communities, our business community and Governor Lynch."

"The Senate's version of CACR 12 targets aid to the neediest school districts which will address the unfairness surrounding the issue of donor towns. It is also likely to preclude the courts from ordering a broad-based tax down the road in order to fund education."
