Senate supports self-funded model for Fish and Game Department

Concord, NH – The New Hampshire Senate passed legislation that would allow New Hampshire Fish and Game Department set license fees through the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules.

The department made a request to operate on a self-funded model, rather than requesting greater General Fund appropriations.

“The Senate decided to allow the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department to set its own licensing fees in order to be self-funded. By giving Fish and Game this ability, the department will be able to better manage its needs which will contribute to its overall success,” said Senate Majority Leader Jeb Bradley (R-Wolfeboro).

“New Hampshire’s Department of Fish and Game plays an important role in the state’s tourism industry and by supporting this legislation we are providing the department with the tools it needs to be successful in engaging local and out-of-state individuals in the state’s hunting, fishing, and outdoor activities,” continued Bradley.
