Bradley statement on UNH Bias-Free Language Guide

Concord, NH – Senate Majority Leader, Senator Jeb Bradley (R-Wolfboro) today released a statement relating to the “Bias-Free Language Guide” found on the University of New Hampshire’s website.

“I am outraged at the Bias Free Language Guide proposed by the University of New Hampshire that frowns upon the use of words ‘American,’ ‘mothering,’ ‘fathering,’ and ‘senior citizen’,” said Senate Majority Leader Jeb Bradley (R-Wolfboro).

“The University System of New Hampshire should concentrate on educating students to compete in the 21st century economy rather than taking political correctness to farcical levels,” continued Bradley.

“Implying the word ‘American’ is not appropriate to use on campus is un-American to say the least. Will UNH next propose to change our Live Free or Die motto to Live Free but Upset No-One?”

“When the subject of UNH funding occurs as the budget gets resolved I look forward to proposing an amendment to rectify this sad state of affairs in Durham,” Bradley added.
