Birdsell applauds passage of bill to strengthen voter laws in the First in the Nation Primary State

Concord, NH – Today, the New Hampshire House of Representatives voted to pass SB 509, a bill changing the procedure for investigating new voters who do not confirm their residency status in New Hampshire.

Senator Regina Birdsell (R-Hampstead) issued the following statement.

“This legislation plays an important role in protecting New Hampshire residents’ right to vote by allowing the Secretary of State’s office to take on a new voter registration verification process, and the Attorney General’s office to focus exclusively on investigating voter fraud cases and enforcing voter laws in the state.”

“This bill allows for a more streamlined process to verify same day voter registrants and is an important improvement aimed greater efficiency in the voter registration process in New Hampshire.”

“I thank both the Senate and the House for moving forward on this important update to strengthen voter laws and practices in our state and urge Governor Hassan to quickly sign this bill into law.”
