Stiles commends fiscally responsible 10-year highway plan for NH

Encouraged by DOT's responsible budgeting

Concord, NH - Today, the Senate approved the 10-year Highway Plan in HB 2016 which prioritizes the State's transportation, road and bridge projects across the state.

Senator Nancy Stiles (R-Hampton), who chairs the Senate Transportation Committee, issued a statement following the vote on HB 2016.

"The 10 year highway plan which passed the Senate today is a fiscally responsible plan that prioritizes roadway projects to be completed in order to continue providing safe and accessible roads and bridges for travelers across our state."

"The Department of Transportation has done an outstanding job of using savings from completed projects to move quickly down the list of other roadway projects and red-listed bridges in need of repair. The 10-year plan will expend more than \$22 million from savings to finish projects which include the fourth lane and exit 4A on I-93 while devoting resources to other priority projects across the state.

"This legislation provides a fiscally responsible plan to address the state's biggest transportation needs ensuring that New Hampshire's roadways continue to be safe and well-maintained."
