## Sanborn stalls lawnmower tax

Concord, NH –Today, the Senate approved HB 1430, which as amended, would ensure that small compact tractors or lawnmowers would not need to be registered to travel on secondary roads.

Senator Andy Sanborn (R-Bedford) issued a statement following the vote.

“As originally presented to the full senate, this bill would have created a \$10 fee to register compact utility tractors. However, with the amendment I sponsored, we removed small tractors and lawnmowers from the provision.”

“The last thing we should do is tax people who might want to help their friends and neighbors get a small, backyard job done. The floor amendment I offered makes it legal for these small tractors or lawnmowers to travel on the roads, following common sense protections, without owners being forced to pay a tax to do so.”

“I commend the Senate’s support on this measure and for protecting New Hampshire citizens against another senseless tax. Now go out and help your neighbor.”
