Morse asks AG to enter education funding settlement with Dover

Concord, NH - Senate President Chuck Morse (R-Salem) issued the following statement regarding the City of Dover V. State of New Hampshire.

"In light of the Court's ruling that the cap on education funding is unconstitutional, it is my view that settling the case with the City of Dover in fiscal year '16 is both fair to Dover and in the best interest of the State of New Hampshire and I've asked the Attorney General to do so."

"As required by law, Senator Regina Birdsell and Senator Andy Sanborn plan to introduce legislation next session that will address the other communities affected by the cap in fiscal year '16, including Bedford and Windham."

"It should be noted that the current education funding formula in place has gradually lifted the cap, and will be fully removed in 2018."
