Bradley commends committee passage of concealed carry bill

Concord, NH - Today, the Senate Judiciary Committee voted ought to pass on a bill to repeal the licensing requirement to carry a concealed firearm.

Senate Majority Leader Jeb Bradley (R-Wolfeboro), the bill's prime sponsor, issued the following statement:

"This legislation simply serves to restore the intent of the U.S. Constitution by eliminating the licensing requirement to carry a concealed firearm by individuals legally able to do so," said Senate Majority Leader Jeb Bradley (R-Wolfeboro). "This issue is about protecting our citizens' lives, liberties and loved ones and that is why we need to restore law-abiding citizens' rights to carry a firearm."

"We know that our neighboring states including Vermont and now Maine allow residents to carry a firearm without a license and they have some of the lowest gun violence rates in the nation. It is time for New Hampshire to join the ranks and I look forward to the support of the House and Governor Sununu on this legislation."
