Innis pleased by NH Drinking Water Commission's progress

Concord, NH -- Senator Dan Innis (R-New Castle) issued the following statement after the New Hampshire Drinking Water and Groundwater Advisory Commission meeting:

"I am pleased to see the Commission moving quickly, bringing in two essential proposals to address local and statewide water issues."

"The two proposals presented to the Commission today included an engineering study to look at the best way to bring water from Portsmouth to homes whose drinking water has been affected by the Coakley Landfill. The presentation also included a project that would conduct an extensive, state-wide survey of nearly 1000 public and private water sources to assess the scope and magnitude of PFC contamination."

"Both of these proposals are important first steps towards correcting contaminated water in public places and private homes. I know the Seacoast will benefit greatly from the Commission's swift action and I urge the Commission to recommend funding for both of these projects."
