Birdsell commends house passage of key election integrity bill

Concord, NH - Today, the House of Representatives approved a bill, SB 3, to clarify the voter residency parameters for New Hampshire elections. Senator Regina Birdsell (R-Hampstead) issued the following statement:

"I commend the support of the House in strengthening the residency requirements for voters in New Hampshire as there is nothing more sacred as a citizen of this state and this nation than the right to cast a ballot in a free and open election."

"This legislation does nothing more than ask a resident to provide proof that they live where they say they do and provides an additional layer of protections increasing the integrity of elections in the state of New Hampshire."

"Passing this legislation in the house today is a significant step forward, balancing the need to ensure that our elections are protected from votes being inappropriately cast with making sure that every eligible voter has a change to cast a ballot."
