# ANALYSIS

This bill clarifies the circumstances under which political advertisements may be placed on public property.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Placement and Removal of Political Advertising. Amend RSA 664:17 to read as follows:  $\mathbf{2}$ 664:17 Placement and Removal of Political Advertising. No political advertising shall be placed 3 on or affixed to any [public property including highway rights-of-way or] private property without 4the owner's consent. All political advertising shall be removed by the candidate no later than the second Friday following the election unless the election is a primary and the advertising concerns a  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 candidate who is a winner in the primary. Signs shall not be placed on or affixed to utility poles or 7highway signs. Political advertising may be placed within state-owned rights-of-way as long as the 8 advertising does not obstruct the safe flow of traffic [and the advertising is placed with the consent of 9 the owner of the land over which the right of way passes]. No person shall remove, deface, or 10knowingly destroy any political advertising which is placed on or affixed to public property or any 11 private property except for removal by the owner of the property, persons authorized by the owner of 12the property, or a law enforcement officer removing improper advertising. Political advertising 13placed on or affixed to any public property may be removed by state, city, or town maintenance or 14law enforcement personnel. Political advertising removed prior to election day by state, city, or town 15maintenance or law enforcement personnel shall be kept until one week after the election at a place 16designated by the state, city, or town so that the candidate may retrieve the items. Consent to the 17placement of political advertising on public property, including state-owned property and highway rights-of-way, shall be presumed unless the property is posted with signs in the 1819same manner as is prescribed in RSA 635:4 with the words "No Political Advertising." 202 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
