1 Grant for School Construction. Amend RSA 198:15-a, IV to read as follows:

IV. Beginning July 1, 2013, and every fiscal year thereafter, school building aid grants for construction or renovation projects approved by the department of education shall [not exceed] be no less than \$50,000,000 per fiscal year less any debt service payments owed in the fiscal year, unless otherwise provided by an act of the general court. School building aid grants shall be funded from appropriations in the state operating budget and no state bonds shall be authorized or issued for the purpose of funding such school building aid grants.

2 New Paragraph; Ten Year Plan for Grant Projects. Amend RSA 198:15-a by inserting after
paragraph IV the following new paragraph:

12V. The department of education shall develop and maintain a 10-year school facilities plan of 13potential school building grant projects. Potential projects shall include, but not be limited to, 14criteria pursuant to RSA 198:15-c, II(b). The 10-year plan is intended to create a method to identify 15and enhance school facilities in a safe, healthy, and efficient manner while providing adequate 16learning environments for New Hampshire's students. The 10-year plan shall be updated every 17biennium to provide the department a summary of projects and school facility capital expenditures 18that are anticipated for the next 10 years. The state board of education shall adopt rules pursuant to RSA 541-A relative to this paragraph. The plan shall identify new construction, renovation, and 1920emergency projects, and describe the overall condition of projects contained in the plan.

3 New Paragraph; School Building Aid; Approval of Plans, Specifications, and Costs of
 Construction or Purchase. Amend RSA 198:15-c by inserting after paragraph IV the following new
 paragraph:

V. Projects that started construction between July 1, 2013 and June 30, 2020, may be considered for reimbursement of 20 percent of project costs paid in a lump sum upon award, provided an application is filed with the commissioner by June 30, 2022.
