6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments:

He-P 2700 contains the permit and licensing requirements for milk producers, milk plants, milk producer-distributors, and milk distributors. He-P 2700 also contains fees that are charged for annual applications and inspections. He-P 2701, He-P 2705.02 intro., (k) and (l), He-P 2707, and He-P 2708 are interim rules scheduled to expire on March 27, 2019.

The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) proposes to readopt He-P 2701 and He-P 2705.02 intro., (k) and (l).

The Department proposes to readopt with amendment He-P 2707 and He-P 2708.

The proposed changes to these rules include:

- In He-P 2707, updating the edition date of the "Application for Bulk Milk Hauler License"; and
- In He-P 2708, updating the edition date of the "Application for a Milk Route Permit".

Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments:

Asb 300 contains the rules governing the certification of assessors, assessing certification levels and duties, assessing personnel background checks, certification education and experience requirements, and the unethical conduct and disciplinary actions pertaining to certified assessing personnel.

Asb 301 on definitions is being readopted with amendments to provide for continuity and uniformity with Rev 600 on property assessment and assessing contract requirements. Proposed Asb 301 includes 24 definitions from Rev 600. It also includes 10 entirely new definitions, namely, Asb 301.08, 301.23, 301.24, 301.26, 301.32, 301.37, 301.40, 301.48, 301.49, and 301.57, to clarify terms that are used within the rule pertaining to duties, education, experience, ethics, and sales chasing pursuant to RSA 21-J:14-b. Existing Asb 301.12 and Asb 301.25 are being deleted and replaced with a single definition, namely, Asb 301.50, which is also from Rev 600. Other definitions have been amended for clarity purposes.

Asb 302 on assessing services contracts, agreements, and personnel background checks is being readopted with amendments to provide clarification pertaining to assessing services contracts. Specifically, proposed Asb 302.02 requires that prior to training any non-certified person to perform measuring and listing of property, or the making of appraisals, a written notification and criminal background check must be provided to the Department of Revenue Administration (DRA).

Asb 303 on requirements for each level of certification is being readopted with amendments to provide clarification and specificity pertaining to the documentation and attestation of training, education, and work experience requirements for each assessing certification level. Due to the expertise and job knowledge required, Asb 303.05 on a DRA-certified property assessor and Asb 303.06 on a DRA-certified property assessor supervisor have been amended with extensive and explicit work experience requirements.

Asb 304 on duties is being readopted with amendments to provide specificity pertaining to the performance of appraisal work and allowable duties for each assessing certification level.

Asb 305 on continuing education is being readopted with amendments to clarify the continued education class requirements and the process to request an extension of time to obtain a criminal background check.

Asb 306 on certification or recertification processes is being readopted with amendments to clarify the certification and recertification processes.

Asb 307 on charge of misconduct against DRA-certified assessing personnel is being readopted with amendments to clarify the types of misconduct and to add the practice of sale chasing pursuant to RSA 21-J:14-b.

Asb 308 on sanctions, suspensions, decertifications and other disciplinary actions is being readopted with amendments to clarify the disciplinary actions for types of misconduct, to add sales chasing pursuant to RSA 21-J:14-b, and to add public disclosure for the findings and decisions of the amount and type of discipline imposed.

6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments:

Cub 304.03, Cub 304.07, Cub 304.08, Cub 304.13, and Cub 304.14 specify the assessment ranges established by the Current Use Board for open space land. Cub 304.03 is being adopted, and Cub 304.07, Cub 304.08, Cub 304.13, and Cub 304.14 are being readopted with amendments, in order to implement the assessment ranges recommended by the Board for open space land assessed on or after April 1, 2019.

Cub 304.03 on assessment ranges for farm land expired on 2-20-17 as an interim rule. It is being adopted without change. Cub 304.07 and Cub 304.08 on assessment ranges for forest land, and Cub 304.13 and Cub 304.14 on assessment ranges for unproductive land and wetland, respectively, are all being readopted with small increases to the assessment ranges.

The amendment allows schools to set the graduation date and not have to reschedule if there are more than 5 snow or emergency days in a school year.

#### 8. Summary explaining the effect of the rule:

He-E 501 describes the services funded under Title XX of the Social Security Act, known as the Social Services Block Grant Act. In New Hampshire, these funds are administered by the NH Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Long Term Supports and Services, Bureau of Elderly and Adult Services. The Department contracts with other organizations to provide Title XX services. Recipients of Title XX services are eligible adults age 60 and older and eligible adults between the ages of 18 and 60 who have a chronic illness or disability. Title XX services enable these adults to maintain their health and independence, and include adult day program services, adult in-home care, essential services (chore, emergency support and respite services), home-delivered meals and homemaker services. If these services are not in place, it is unlikely that these adults could stay in the community, which would result in premature institutionalization. Most of He-E 501 is scheduled to expire on January 12, 2019.

The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) is proposing to file an interim rule pursuant to RSA 541-A:19, I(e) to minimize the time between the expiration of the rules and their subsequent readoption by the agency. The provisions of He-E 501 that are not expiring have been included so that the proposal as a whole is understandable.

The proposed interim rule, He-C 1550, specifies the requirements for health care facilities licensed under RSA 151 to file financial health care data with the Department, including the types of financial data to be filed, the timeframes and format for filing, the penalties for not filing required data, and provisions for the confidentiality of such data.
