### Food Waste context

### Why is reducing food waste important?

- Environmental impact
  - If food waste was a country, it would be the 3<sup>rd</sup> biggest emitter of greenhouse gases, just after the USA and China.

### Economic impact

• US spends \$218 billion a year growing, processing, transporting, and disposing food that is never eaten.

#### A societal issue

- According to the FAO, 1/3 of food produced is wasted
- This is enough to feed 3 billion people
- People in need in our communities





## Food Recovery Hierarchy

#### **Source Reduction**

Reduce the volume of surplus food generated

#### **Feed Hungry People**

Donate extra food to food banks, soup kitchens and shelters

#### **Feed Animals**

Divert food scraps to animal feed

#### **Industrial Uses**

Provide waste oils for rendering and fuel conversion and food scraps for digestion to recover energy

#### Composting

Create a nutrient-rich

#### Landfill/ Incineration

Least Preterred Last resort to disposal

47 Local farms receiving livestock feed donations:































## **Hannaford Food Waste Numbers**
