


The Federal Military Budget provides for Soldier and Airman pay, training, equipment, and uniforms. Our State Operating (and Capital) Budget must support this \$200 million dollar Federal Military Budget at the State level by providing facilities and support to the New Hampshire National Guard - and also provide for the New Hampshire Veterans Services. These two separate budgets complement and support each other.

Summary of Changes

- 1) Change four (4) currently funded positions to 100% Federal Funds by eliminating their associated General Funds (saves \$215,406):
 - Two (2) positions from 100% General-AU2220 to 100% Federal-AU2245 (ARNG maintenance related)
 - Two (2) positions from 75% Federal/25% General-AU2233 to 100% Federal-AU2252 (ANG maintenance)
- 2) Seven (7) new positions. Three positions are 100% federally reimbursed and will directly support the NH National Guard. One position is 75% federally funded, 25% general funded and will provide maintenance support to two NH National Guard facilities. The three remaining are 100% general fund positions required in the 2020 Veterans Bill of Rights. These positions will allow us to comply with the provisions of the newly passed law.
 - Clerk of the Work: AU2245 100% Federal
 - Accountant I: AU2245 100% Federal
 - Technical Support Specialist III: AU3133 100% Federal
 - Maintenance Mechanic II: AU3003 75% Federal and 25% General
 - Grants Program Coordinator: AU1015 100% General 2020 Veterans Bill of Rights
 - Program Specialist II: AU1015 100% General 2020 Veterans Bill of Rights
 - Program Specialist II: AU1015 100% General 2020 Veterans Bill of Rights
- 3) Increase Utilities Funds
 - New Pembroke Armory (completed in FY20)-\$60,000: AU2240 50% Federal and 50% General
 - New Joint National Guard/State Police Hangar in Concord (FY23)-\$60,000: AU2220 100% General



House Amendment Changes:

Amendment to HB 2-FN-A-LOCAL

- Page 14 -
- 37 New Section; Department of Military Affairs and Veterans Services; Support for Veterans Mental Health and Social Isolation. Amend RSA 110-B by inserting after section 73-c the following new section:

110-B:73-d Support for Veterans Mental Health and Social Isolation. The Department of Military Affairs and Veterans Services shall coordinate access to mental health programs available through the United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), including but not limited to the VA Solid Start program, which contacts every veteran multiple times by phone in the first year after they leave active duty to check in and help connect them to VA programs and benefits, the Buddy Check program through which veterans reach out to each other to provide peer support, and the proposed Green Alert Act, which will help to locate veterans when they go missing so they can receive appropriate care, in a manner similar to the Silver Alert system for older Americans and the Amber Alert system for children. The department will help veterans to find and enroll in the variety of mental health programs offered by the VA.

Section XII of SB 143

There is currently no appropriation associated with Section XII of SB 143. This bill seeks to convert the NH National Guard Scholarship Program to the NH National Guard Enlistment Incentive Program. Recruiting is currently the number one priority for the NH National Guard. This program authorizes a cash incentive up to \$500 to current members of the New Hampshire National Guard in the pay grades of E-1 to O-3 or any former member of the New Hampshire National Guard for each new or prior service recruit that they bring into the New Hampshire National Guard. This legislation was filed after we submitted our budget, so there is no request in the current proposal. We ask that the committee consider adding 25,000.00 to the budget to support this program.
