The officer with whom primary petitions are filed shall 20 immediately upon receipt thereof examine the same and ascertain whether they conform to the law. 21If found not to conform thereto or to be conflicting as provided in RSA 655:23, [he] they shall then 22 endorse thereon the reason why such petition cannot be accepted and shall, within 24 hours, return 23 the same to the candidate in whose behalf it was filed. In such case, the candidate may file 24supplementary petitions with the official, but not later than the third Wednesday in June. 25 7 Ballot Law Commission; Hearing Date. Amend the introductory paragraph of RSA 665:5, I to 26 read as follows: 27 I. If necessary, the ballot law commission shall meet on the third Thursday of [September] 28 August in each general election year and the third Friday following the presidential primary 29 election in order to hear and decide: 30 8 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
