Joint Statement

Legislative Leaders, Governor Sununu, Department of Energy Unveil Energy Initiatives

Concord, NH: House Speaker Sherman Packard (R-Londonderry) and Senate President Chuck Morse (R-Salem) issued a joint statement about the new energy initiatives released today with Governor Sununu and the Department of Energy:

Disastrous national policy has been driving this energy crisis and the result is record-high inflation, rising consumer costs, and sticker shock at the gas pumps. Through smart fiscal management, Republicans in Concord can provide relief for Granite Staters of nearly \$70 million in surplus funds. With these reallocated surplus funds, a combination of LIHEAP federal funds, Electric Assistance program funds, and NH Emergency Energy Relief funds, we will be able to provide an additional \$100 million in relief to the most vulnerable citizens in the coming months.

Speaker Packard said: "In a unified effort, Republicans are looking ahead to how we can further help our citizens to make sure they do not have to decide whether to put heating oil in their tanks or food on their tables. We are going to make sure that does not happen in the state of New Hampshire. **He concluded**: "I can guarantee that we will take care of our citizens."
