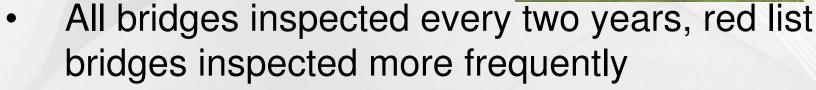

 - Municipal Red List 243 (14.4%)







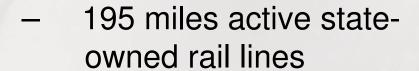

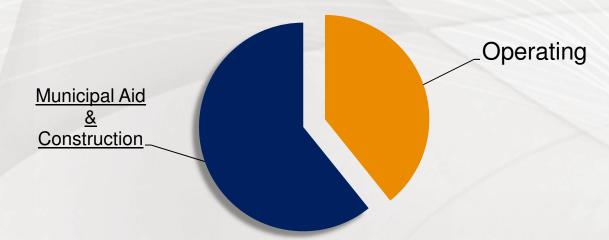

Funding Summary

- FY 2020 Actual Expenditures = \$681 million
 - Municipal Aid and Construction Costs = \$419 million
 - Operating Costs = \$262 million



- Comprised of various funding sources
 - Highway (36%), Federal (35%), Turnpike (19%), Other (9%),
 General (1%)



Highway Fund

- Highway Fund is not the DOT and DOT is not the Highway Fund
- Fund which unrestricted revenue from gas tax/road toll and registration fees is collected by Dept. of Safety
- Primary source of funding for Operating Budget
- Revenue from Highway Fund appropriated to various agencies, DOT, Safety, Judicial Branch and Justice

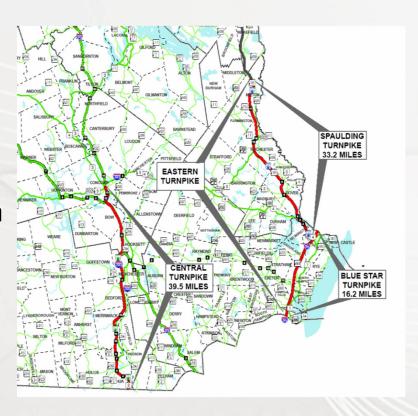

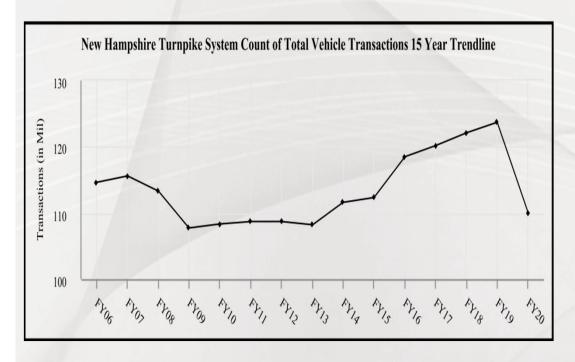
Turnpike System Overview

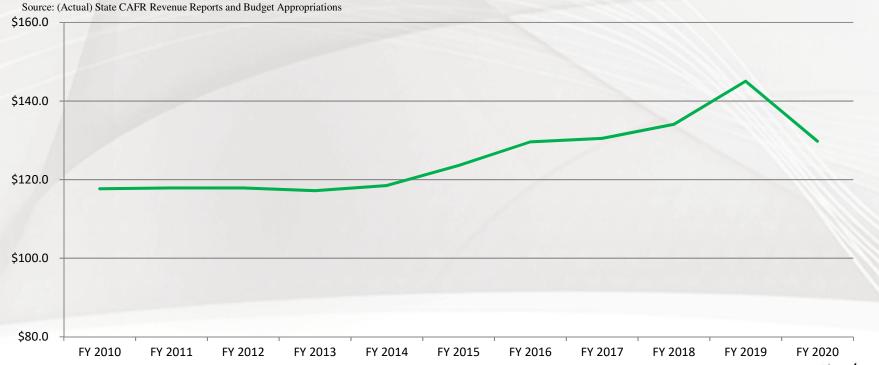
