They provide the procedures for third-party administrators to apply for and renew their licenses. They also provide the procedures for the Department of Labor to license and regulate third-party administrators. The former Lab 408.01 through Lab 408.17 expired 2-25-19 and are being adopted again. Lab 408.18 on the application form has not expired but is being readopted with amendments.

Nur 704.04 governs program coordinator qualifications for nursing assistant educational programs. The intended action is to remove the requirement that "Train-the-Trainer" courses must be 12 hours in length. Specifically, the intended action removes the requirement that individuals wishing to become a program coordinator complete a 12 hour board-approved "Train-the-Trainer" course. While individuals wishing to become a program coordinator will still have to complete a Board-approved "Train-the-Trainer" course, the requirement that the course be 12 hours will be stricken.

Chapter Saf-C 600 regulates hazardous materials transportation. Saf-C 603.01 incorporates by reference federal regulations. 5. Short Title: Amendments to Operating Standards for Youth Recreational Camps

6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments:

Env-Wq 900 implements RSA 485-A:24 relative to youth recreation camps (YRCs) and youth skills camps (YSCs). Env-Wq 904 establishes requirements for YRC staff, and Env-Wq 907 establishes health care requirements, including health care staffing requirements. Amendments are being proposed to (1) prohibit owners of YRCs convicted of certain criminal offenses from working directly with campers, and (2) to make the health care staffing requirements consistent for day and residence camps operated for both campers who are physically or mentally disabled and those who are not. The proposed amendments also would extend health care staffing requirements, which currently apply only to overnight camping trips, to all off-site trips. Finally, the proposed amendments would clarify that health care staffing requirements apply only when campers are present.

6. (b) Brief description of the groups affected:

Any individual or entity who wishes to own, operate, work at, attend, or send a child or children to a youth recreation camp or a youth skills in New Hampshire will be affected by the proposed rules.
