All people in NH have equitable opportunity to flourish and achieve optimal mental, physical, social, spiritual, and emotional wellness.

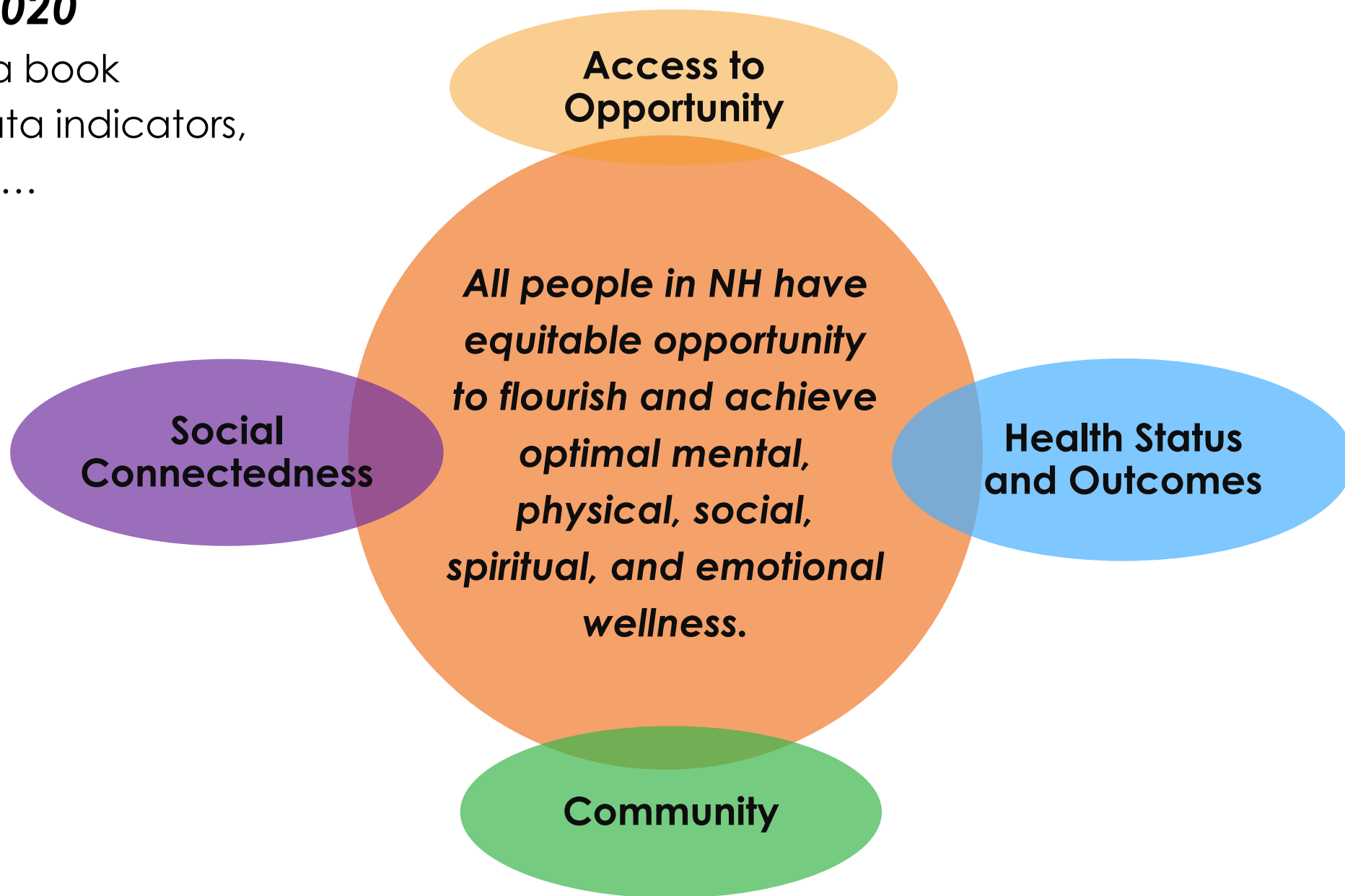
“People” include individuals and families across the lifespan.

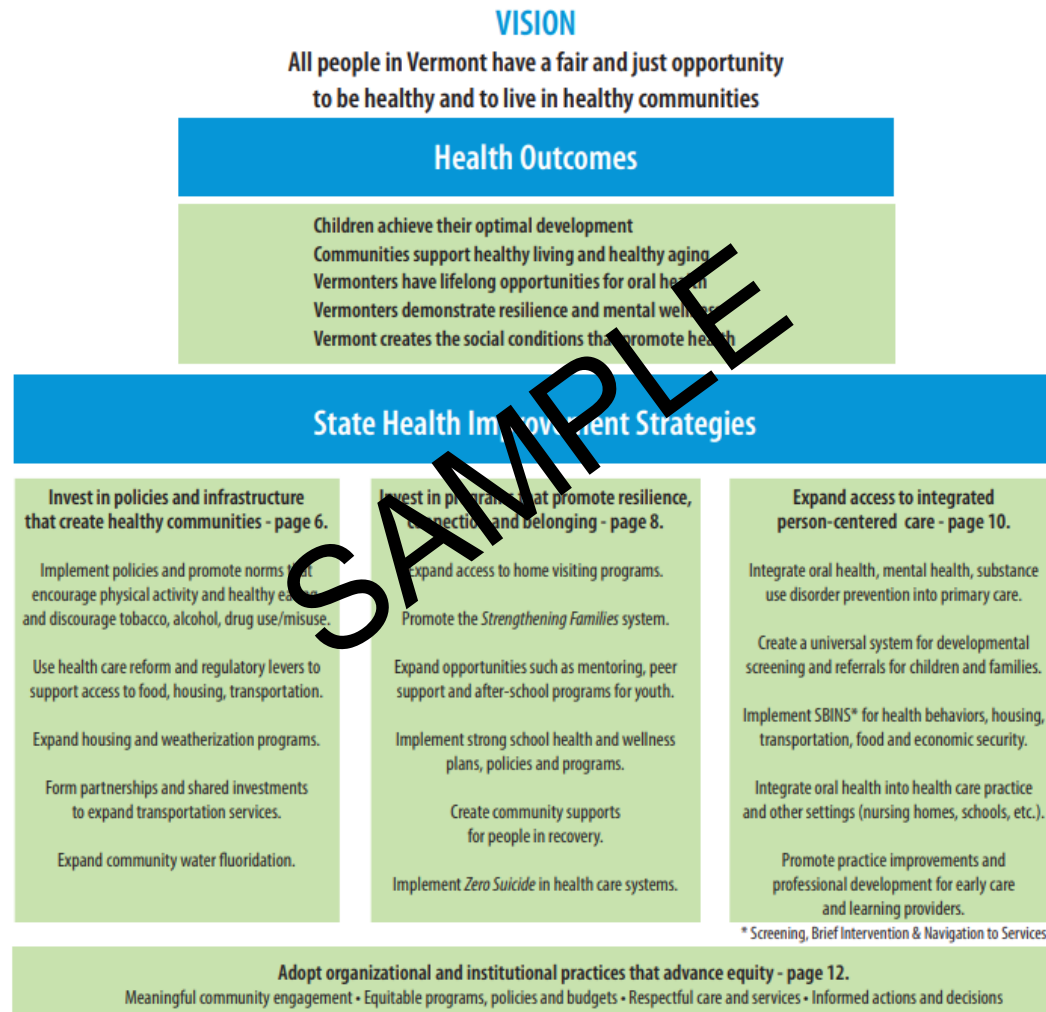
